The chair for information systems research at the University of Freiburg (Prof. Dr. Dirk Neumann) has an open PhD / Postdoc position. The position is dedicated to a project "machine learning in portfolio management" and is located in Hamburg at our project partner.

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Candidates (m. / f.) should be interested in one (or more) of the following methods/areas:

- Machine learning / artificial intelligence
- Data mining
- Business intelligence / business analytics
- Optimization / operations research
- Time series analysis

We do not focus on candidates from a specific study area. Currently our team members have very diverse backgrounds, such as Computer Science, Economics, Management, Physics, Mathematics, and Engineering. Candidates should be eager to solve analytical tasks, ideally, combined with intermediate programming skills (e.g. in R, Python).

The chair has a strong placement record and is very research-oriented. Previous colleagues have taken prestigious positions at University of Oxford, ETH Zurich, Erasmus University Rotterdam, and in the industry in after completing their PhD.
